Our Club History

The Zonta Club of Tuguegarao was first organized on September 3, 1980, when Miss Margarita Otero, then President of the Zonta Club of Baguio sat down with twelve women leaders of Tuguegarao and explained to them the “Why’s” and “How’s” of Zonta International.

That same night, the first set of officers got elected with Teresa Javier-Dupaya, then Governor of Cagayan as Charter President. Charie Lim, who was at that time manager of the Philippine National Bank (PNB) Tuguegarao Branch, became the First Vice President, but her position was eventually taken over by Benny Fermin, because Charie got transferred to a new station. Mona Bautista was elected Second Vice President; Ofie Castro Padilla who was then Provincial Administrator of the Province of Cagayan and Executive Assistant to Governor Dupaya became Secretary; Finni Yuri was chosen as Treasurer; Nelly De Leon, Assistant Treasurer, while the members of the Board were Jopot Bautista, Chiching Stoops and Menching Duque. With the above Charter Officers, the Zonta Club of Tuguegarao was born. From the group of twelve (12) the Charter Members became twenty seven (27).

On August 3, 1981, the Zonta Club of Tuguegarao was chartered. On the Presentation of Charter, the District Governor, Justic eCecille Munoz-Palma, Area Director Suva Yuvienco and Zonta Club of Baguio President Margarita Otero graced the occasion. It was indeed a very memorable one.

In its infancy stage, the Zonta Club of Tuguegarao was shepherded by Teresing Dupaya fo four consecutive years, 1980-1984. Her warm and caring personality caused the Club to let out its tiny roots and leaves as more members were invited to the club. It was a period of adjustment, of struggles, a period of conflicting likes and dislikes, a period of fluctuating directions and decisions but the tiny plant survived.
